SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Allocations for Career Coaches

Career and Technical Education (CTE) career coach allocations for FY 2024 will be funded in the amount of \$95,881.00. This allocation includes salaries and benefits in the amount of \$71,055.00, Other Current Expense (OCE) in the amount of \$23,068.00, and classroom instructional supply funds in the amount of \$1,758.00.

An updated copy of a sample Career Coach Job Description and a list of local education agencies (LEAs) career coach allocations, including new career coach allocations for FY 2024, are attached. These allocations are 100 percent state funds and should be budgeted and expended using Revenue and Fund Source 1284 and Object Code 112. Funds for foundation-program-funded career coach allocations will be listed as an additional CTE director in the FY 2024 LEA Unit Breakdown report and will be sent monthly with the state funds electronic transfer beginning October 2023 through September 2024. Funds for Career and Technical Initiative-funded career coach allocations will be funded via a Memorandum of Agreement on a reimbursement basis. Any unused funds not expended by September 30, 2024, will revert back to the Alabama State Department of Education.
